- Focus on structure
- Predict exam questions
- A way to receive feedback
- Passive learning becomes active learning

Mirror Questions

Reflect on the basic or major facts and ideas.

Examples:

- What is the New Deal?
- Who was Harriet Tubman?
- When was the Battle of Hastings?

Summary Questions

Sum up the theme or main idea. These questions are more general and allow you to think in sections.

Examples:

- Explain how the setting foreshadows the...
- Describe the relationship between quantities.

High Level Questions

These questions require you to think at a high level, and often begin with "why," "how," or "compare."

Examples:

- How does socialism differ from communism?
- Compare prokaryotes to eukaryotes.
