Upper Division (Junior and Senior Years)		12
<i>Students are required to select three courses (for a total of 12 credits) from an upper-division cluster which is directly linked to one of the three Sophomore Inquiry classes previously taken. Upper-division cluster courses may not be used to fulfill a student's major or program requirements.</i>		
Senior Capstone Experience		6
<i>This six-credit capstone course is the culminating general education experience for seniors. Students join an interdisciplinary team, develop strategy to address a problem/concern in the community, and implement this strategy over one, two, or three quarters of work.</i>

With departmental approval, the distribution of Applied Music credits may be altered; however, a minimum of 12 of the 24 credits must be completed at the upper-division level. A minimum of 6 of the 12 Large Ensemble credits must be completed at the upper-division level.

‡ Music majors must enroll in the related Chamber Music Ensemble.
