
- The percent of occupied units paying less than \$500 in gross rent decreased from 2014 (11.1%) to 2018 (6.4%). This is already adjusted for inflation and the difference is statistically significant as indicated by the *
- Median rent is on the rise from 2014 (\$845) to 2018 (\$1,008). This, too, is already adjusted for inflation.






