She said that PSU's program in Visually Impaired Learners, recently renamed Blindness and Low Vision, was one of the few in the U.S. The program is largely online and recruits regionally, including in Alaska and Hawaii. Like many other COE programs, they are taking an existing licensure program and using the same coursework to create a graduate certificate so that students will be eligible for financial aid.
