## ADMISSION

All students who expect to receive the Master of Arts in Music or Master of Science in Music degree must apply for admission both to the Music Department and the Office of Registration and Records. The applications must be made for the term in which the student wishes to be admitted. The student may transfer no more than 15 credits into the program. These credits include all credits taken at PSU before formal admission to the graduate program.

## ADMISSION EXAMINATION

All students must take the Departmental Graduate Diagnostic Entrance Examination at the beginning of the first term of graduate work. This examination is given on Mondays, one week prior to the first day of Fall, Spring, and Summer terms. Master of Arts candidates must also pass a language examination.

## EXIT EXAMINATION

6-hour comprehensive examination covering Arranging, Education/Pedagogy, Literature, and Score Identification relating to student's program of study. The exam is given twice yearly on the third Saturday of May and July. Students must be enrolled for at least 1 credit during the term in which the Exit Exam is taken.
