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## HOW TO APPLY

Submit your application and pay the \$52 application fee Eligible applicants can defer the application fee.

Submit official transcripts from all schools attended

**Optional: Submit test scores** PSU accepts the SAT and ACT tests.

**Submit the Free Application for Federal** Student Aid (FAFSA) Submission of the FAFSA is not required. If you are not eligible to submit the FAFSA, you can submit the Oregon Student Aid Application

> (ORSAA). We encourage students to submit the FAFSA as soon as possible after October 1.

## ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Students earning college credit while in high school, through programs such as Early College or Running Start, are considered freshmen for admission purposes. If you earned college credit while in high school, you must meet PSU's GPA requirements for both freshman and transfer students.

#### **FRESHMAN**

- · Graduate from high school with a cumulative unweighted GPA of at least 3.0 and earn grades of C- or better in the following areas:
  - o English: 4 units
  - Math: 3 units including Algebra II
  - Science: 3 units
  - Social Studies: 3 units
  - o Oregon high school graduates only: 2 units of the same second language

#### **TRANSFER**

Students with 30 or more transferable quarter credits (20 semester credits) earned after high school graduation

- · 2.25 cumulative GPA, or 2.0 with a transferable associate degree
- Complete WR121 or equivalent with a grade of C- or better
- · Oregon high school graduates only: Complete 2 units of the same second language


