# **Entrepreneurial Careers**

- Opportunities for anyone, regardless of immigration status:
  - Independent contracting
  - Starting a business
  - Freelancing
  - Worker cooperatives
- Over 823,000 undocumented entrepreneurs
- ITINs or EINs may be used to legally earn income so long as taxes are filed and paid

## **Individual Tax Identification Number (ITIN)**

- ITIN needed for independent contractor to be paid
- May have an ITIN if parents have filed income taxes and claimed individual as a dependent
- If no ITIN learn how to obtain one on IRS.gov or by using one of the following resources:

## **Parker Dewey Micro-Internships**

- Partners with organizations and colleges to post short-term, paid, professional projects, usually 5 to 40 hours of work
- All micro-internships are structured as independent contract work
- Undocumented students can apply (must have SSN or ITIN)
- NO COST to students!

# **Worker Cooperatives**

- A business structured as an LLC (example: Radiate Consulting)
- Members own and manage the company operates according to a set of principles
  - Members invest in the business
  - Members vote in decision making
