Key Findings from the Lane County KITS Evaluation 2016 & 2017

## What is KITS?

KITS is an evidence-based program

helping children & parents start kindergarten successfully.

KITS provides:

### 1/2 day sessions for children at local elementary schools

- Led by trained staff (often kindergarten teachers)
- Builds early academic skills, improves social-emotional and selfregulation skills, and familiarizes children with school routines and environments.

**Parent workshops** increasing parenting skills and honing strategies to communicate with teachers and advocate within the school system.

KITS is provided in English & Spanish.

## 42 school catchment areas in 13 school districts

served Lane County children more likely to start school with fewer school readiness skills.



## What was the Research Study?

### Study Goal

Was KITS successful in improving:



**Children's** self-regulation, socialemotional, & early literacy skills

Parenting skills & Parent-school relationships



## Portland State

### The study included:

- One small, "gold standard" randomized study.
- One larger "comparison group" study.



#### Children & families participated

- 514 received KITS
- 138 "comparison" families did not receive KITS.



### Parent & child outcomes

measured at the beginning and end of KITS .
