##### **SOCC Required Health, Wellness and Fitness**

- \_\_\_ Choose 3 credits of HE250 Personal Health or PE231 Wellness for Life (or substitute 3 credits of PE185 sports/activities)

##### **SOCC Arts and Letters Specific Electives**


- \_\_\_ Choose 9 credits of any Arts and Letters courses (Refer to SOCC Associate of Science Degree requirements course list.)

##### **SOCC CJ, EMT and HD100 Specific Electives**

- \_\_\_ Choose 9-12 credits of any Criminal Justice (CJ) or Emergency Management (EMT) prefix course and HD100 College Success and Survival

##### **SOCC Science/Math/Computer Science Electives**

- \_\_\_ Choose 12 credits in Science/Math/Computer Science. Eight (8) of 12 credits must be a laboratory course. (Refer to Associate of Science Degree requirements course list.)

 **PSU Transfer Tip:** Use Science/Math/Computer Science Specific Electives to work towards meeting PSU's 12 credit **science** requirement (8 of 12 science credits must have a lab attached)

## Criminal Justice AS Degree Transfer Guide

All students must satisfy both Bachelor of Science degree requirements and Criminology & Criminal Justice (CCJ) major requirements. Southwestern Oregon CC students who complete an AS degree in Criminal Justice can generally expect their courses to transfer to the PSU Bachelor of Science and CCJ major as shown below.

### I. AS in Criminal Justice Degree Application to PSU Bachelor of Science Degree Requirements

- ✓ **Satisfied:** PSU 8 credit Writing requirement
    - WR121/WR121H & WR122/WR122H
  - ✓ **Satisfied:** PSU 12 credits in Social Science or Arts & Letters general education requirement
    - Met by a combination of AS in Criminal Justice required courses
  - ✓ **Satisfied:** PSU University Studies 15 credits Freshman Inquiry
    - Met by total AS Criminal Justice degree credits earned
  - ✓ **Satisfied:** PSU 4 credit Math requirement
    - Met by AS in Criminal Justice required Math courses
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- **May Be Satisfied Depending on Credits Chosen:** PSU 12 credit Science requirement
    - May be satisfied if a student utilizes 12 credits of required Science/Math/Computer Science Specific Electives to complete 12 science credits (8 credits with a lab or fieldwork attached) in any of the following sciences: Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science/Studies, Geology, Physics, and Science Education (SCI).
  - **May Be Satisfied Depending on Transfer Credits:** PSU University Studies 12 credits Sophomore Inquiry can be satisfied with transfer of 90 credits to PSU
    - Not all AS in Criminal Justice credits earned at Southwestern Oregon CC transfer to PSU because vocational, cooperation education, and physical education credits are capped at 12 transfer credits each. Transfer credits are determined by PSU Admissions.

### II. AS in Criminal Justice Degree Application to PSU Criminology & Criminal Justice (CCJ) Major Requirements

- ✓ **Satisfied:** PSU 3 CCJ required courses: 200/300, CCJ 230/301, and CCJ 240/303
  - Met by AS in Criminal Justice required CJ courses CJ100, CJ110 and CJ130.
  - 32 credits of required CCJ courses remain to be completed through PSU
- ✓ **Satisfied:** 8 credits of CCJ elective courses
  - Met by a combination of required CJ courses for AS in Criminal Justice
  - 16 credits of Upper Division elective CCJ courses remain to be completed through PSU
