All students must satisfy both Bachelor of Science degree requirements and Criminology & Criminal Justice (CCJ) major requirements. Chemeketa students who complete an AAS degree in Criminal Justice can generally expect their courses to transfer to the PSU Bachelor of Science and CCJ major as shown below.

I. AAS in Criminal Justice Degree Application to PSU Bachelor of Science Degree Requirements

- ✓ **Satisfied**: PSU 8 credit Writing requirement
 - o WR121 & choosing WR 227
- ✓ Satisfied: PSU 10 credits minimum in Social Science or Arts & Letters general education requirement
 - Met by a combination of AAS in Criminal Justice required & elective courses
- ✓ Satisfied: PSU University Studies 15 credits Freshman Inquiry
 - Met by total AAS Criminal Justice degree credits earned
- > May Be Satisfied Depending on Credits Chosen: PSU 3 credits minimum Math requirement
 - May be satisfied if student utilizes 15 credits of required Gen. Ed. elective coursework to complete Math 105 or higher.
 - Number of Chemeketa prerequisites required to register for Math 105 varies depending a student's Chemeketa math placement test results.
- May Be Satisfied Depending on Credits Chosen: PSU 10 credits minimum Science requirement; of which 2 courses (6 credits minimum) must have a lab or fieldwork component
 - May be satisfied if a student:
 - 1. Utilizes only 3 of the 15 Gen Ed electives to complete Math 105 or higher, and
 - 2. Utilizes remaining AAS Gen Ed elective credits to complete a minimum of 10 science credits (6 credits with a lab or fieldwork component) in any of the following sciences: Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science/Studies, Geology, Physics, and Science Education (SCI).
- ➤ May Be Satisfied Depending on Transfer Credits: PSU University Studies 12 credits Sophomore Inquiry can be satisfied with transfer of 90 credits to PSU
 - Not all AAS in Criminal Justice credits earned at Chemeketa CC transfer to PSU because vocational, cooperation education, and physical education credits are capped at 12 transfer credits each.
 Transfer credits are determined by PSU Admissions.

II. AAS in Criminal Justice Degree Application to PSU Criminology & Criminal Justice (CCJ) Major Requirements

- ✓ Satisfied: PSU 3 CCJ required courses: CCJ 200/300, CCJ 230/301, and CCJ 240/303
 - Met by AAS in Criminal Justice required courses CJ101, CJ130 and choosing AAS in CJ Criminal Justice electives (1) CJ110 or CJ112.
 - 32 credits of required CCJ courses remain to be completed through PSU
- ✓ **Satisfied**: 8 credits of CCJ elective courses
 - o Met by a combination of required CJ courses for AAS in Criminal Justice
 - 16 credits of Upper Division elective CCJ courses remain to be completed through PSU
