## Math/Science/Computer Science Required Classes (12 credits)

\_\_\_\_Must complete 12 credits from SOCC Math/Science/Computer Science<sup>3</sup> course list. At least 2 courses (minimum of 6 credits) must include SOCC Lab Science course options.

PSU Transfer Tip: PSU requires 10 credits minimum of Science coursework; of which, 2 courses (6 credits minimum) must have a lab or fieldwork component. To satisfy the PSU science requirement upon transfer from the AS Degree at MHCC, **PSU recommends taking 10 credits of Science courses as follows**:

#### Arts and Letters Required Classes (9 credits minimum)

## **Criminal Justice AS Degree Transfer Map**

All students must satisfy both Bachelor of Science degree requirements and Criminology & Criminal Justice (CCJ) major requirements. Southwestern Oregon CC students who complete an AS degree in Criminal Justice can generally expect their courses to transfer to the PSU Bachelor of Science and CCJ major as shown below.

### I. AS in Criminal Justice Degree Application to PSU Bachelor of Science Degree Requirements

- ✓ **Satisfied**: PSU 8 credit Writing requirement
  - WR121 & WR122 & WR 227
- Satisfied: PSU 10 credits minimum in Social Science or Arts & Letters general education requirement
  Met by a combination of AS in Criminal Justice required courses
- ✓ Satisfied: PSU University Studies 15 credits Freshman Inquiry
  - o Met by total AS Criminal Justice degree credits earned
- ✓ Satisfied: PSU 3 credits minimum Math requirement
  - $\circ$   $\,$  Met by completion of MTH 105 or higher & MTH 243.
- May Be Satisfied Depending on Credits Chosen: PSU 10 credits minimum Science requirement; of which 2 courses (6 credits minimum) must have a lab or fieldwork component
  - May be satisfied if student utilizes 10 credits of required SOCC Science/Math/Computer Science coursework to complete 10 credits minimum of Science coursework; of which, 2 courses (6 credits minimum) must be Lab Science coursework.
- May Be Satisfied Depending on Transfer Credits: PSU University Studies 12 credits Sophomore Inquiry can be satisfied with transfer of 90 credits to PSU
  - Not all AS in Criminal Justice credits earned at Southwestern Oregon CC transfer to PSU because vocational, cooperation education, and physical education credits are capped at 12 transfer credits each. Transfer credits are determined by PSU Admissions.

### II. AS in Criminal Justice Degree Application to PSU Criminology & Criminal Justice (CCJ) Major Requirements

- ✓ *Satisfied*: PSU 3 CCJ required courses: CCJ 200/300, CCJ 230/301, and CCJ 240/303

- ✓ Satisfied: 8 credits of CCJ elective courses
  - Met by a combination of required CJ courses for AS in Criminal Justice
  - o 16 credits of Upper Division elective CCJ courses remain to be completed through PSU
