New video and photos of solar eclipse

On the anniversary of last year's total solar eclipse, a team of PSU engineering students and alumni released a video and high-resolution photos showing the eclipse shadow as it moves across Oregon. Funded by a nationwide NASA project, the PSU team launched five highaltitude hydrogen balloons from Corvallis, Ore. Cameras mounted on the balloons took approximately 180,000 photos, which were used to create panoramic images of the earth, sun and moon during the eclipse. READ MORE

Establishing Native studies

This fall, Portland State is offering Oregon's first bachelor's degree in Indigenous Nations and Native American Studies, which will provide Natives and non-Natives with opportunities to study the history, culture, values and contemporary issues of Native peoples. A petition, survey and letters of support showed that there was demand for the major, and in June, the Oregon Higher Education Coordinating Commission unanimously approved it.

After a nationwide search, Mary Schumacher-Hoerner was chosen new director for the Helen Gordon Child Development Center, the University's early childhood center and laboratory school. She was most recently an associate professor of early childhood education and director of the Child and Family Development Center at San Juan College in New Mexico. Schumacher-Hoerner succeeds
