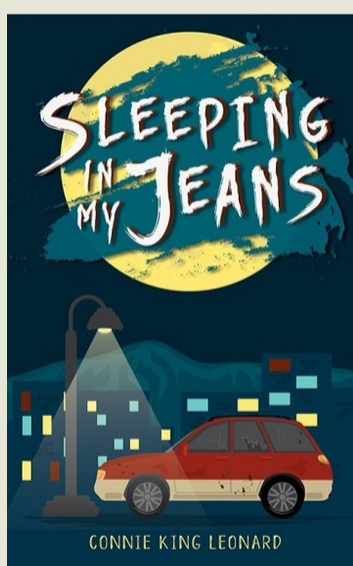


PSU Orchestra, The Portland Ballet present *A Midsummer Night's Dream*
