



Students write about 500-year-old

Eighteen student research papers about the PSU Library's recently acquired <u>16th-century *Book of Hours*</u> are now online. In Spring 2018, students in the Medieval Portland Senior Capstone studied the book,

which was printed in 1507 by Thielman Kerver, and analyzed its historical and contextual significance, use of symbolism and physical condition. Professor Anne McClanan and Maud Pérez-Simon, a visiting scholar from Université Sorbonne Nouvelle in Paris, taught the class and oversaw the students' work.
