A groundbreaking ceremony was held Friday, Jan. 11, to celebrate the \$104 million civic, education and health center under construction at southwest Fourth Ave. and Montgomery St. The seven-story Fourth and Montgomery Building is slated for completion in fall 2020 and will house the OHSU-PSU School of Public Health; PSU's College of Education; PCC's Dental Hygiene and Dental Assisting programs; and the City of Portland's Bureau of Planning and Sustainability as well as ground-floor retail and restaurants.
