Woman rabbi to share story at annual Solomon lecture

Rabbi Angela Warnick Buchdahl is a person of firsts in the U.S. Jewish community. Her talk, "<u>Being</u> <u>a Stranger: A Story of a</u> <u>Wandering Jew</u>," is Thursday, Jan. 24, 7:30 p.m. in the Smith Union Ballroom. Buchdahl is the first woman



to lead a large Reform congregation in New York City and the first Asian American to be ordained as cantor or rabbi in North America. Her talk is the University's 14th Annual Gus and Libby Solomon Memorial Lecture and is free and open to the public.

PSU exploring acquisition of Oregon College of Art and Craft

The University is exploring a potential agreement with the <u>Oregon</u> <u>College of Art and Craft</u> (OCAC) in Southwest Portland. OCAC is a small, mentor-based college founded in 1907 that offers bachelor and master's degree programs in Fine Art as well as an array of community programs, lectures and exhibitions for adults and youth. A potential acquisition would create an opportunity for PSU's School of Art + Design in the College of the Arts to expand program offerings. Cooperative computer science program now in Oregon high schools

A program spearheaded by Portland State to teach computer science to all high school students—especially populations underrepresented in computer science such as women, rural students and minorities completed its first semester in 16 school districts throughout Oregon. The program is made possible by CS (Computer Science) for Oregon, which is funded by a \$1 million grant from the National Science Foundation to support a team of Oregon educators led by PSU's Maseeh College of Engineering and Computer Science. <u>READ MORE</u>

Workplace rudeness affects sleep

Incivilities such as sarcastic comments and demeaning language are becoming more common in the workplace, and employees' sleep—and that of their partners—might be suffering as a result, according to a new study from Portland State and University of Illinois researchers. Psychology faculty member Charlotte Fritz is lead author of the study, which was recently published in the journal <u>Occupational Health</u> <u>Science</u>. It builds on previous research by examining the relationship between workplace and employee sleep in the context of dual-earner couples. Researchers surveyed 305 couples. <u>READ MORE</u>
