For the first time ever, the annual Portland Winter Light Festival is <u>coming to campus Feb. 7-9</u>. More than 20 events are planned at Portland State, including interactive illuminated games at Peter W. Stott Community Field, a 40-foot-diameter geodesic dome at Urban Plaza, and musical performances projected on the façade of Millar Library. The Portland Winter Light Festival is free and family-friendly. Events take place each night from 6 to 11 p.m.
