PSU has been able to offer new courses and public lectures to meet heightened interest in Korea and Korean language—thanks to support from the Korean community. This month a \$108,000 gift from the Korean government was matched by the local community. Their contributions have helped secure Danny Kim, a Korean historian who is in his second year of a visiting professorship at PSU. Kim's public lectures have attracted standing-room-only crowds. His next free lecture is at 6 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 27, in 327 Smith Union and is on chastity in colonial Korea.
