The University faces tuition hikes and cost cutting without more state funding

On March 18, Portland State leaders detailed the daunting budget and tuition challenges facing the University over the next two years and the need to rally for more state support. At a packed campus Budget Town Hall for faculty and staff, President Rahmat Shoureshi and other administrators said current funding proposals in Salem would likely result in unpopular tuition increases and other steps to avert cuts in academic and support programs. terminated all subscriptions with Elsevier Publishing, the publisher of over 2,500 scientific journals. They wrote, "Elsevier was unwilling to meet UC's key goal: securing universal open access to UC research while containing the rapidly escalating costs associated with for-profit journals." PSU participates in a cooperative Elsevier contract with Oregon State and University of Oregon, which expires December 2020. Leading up to that, the PSU Library will work closely with PSU administration and the Faculty Senate Library Committee to look at usage, costs and open access.
