Ken Ames, professor emeritus in Anthropology, passed away on Sunday, April 21. "He was a beloved professor and colleague," says Virginia Butler, Anthropology chair, "who made major contributions to archaeology in the Pacific Northwest and archaeological theory more generally. He will be sorely missed." The family will be holding a wake later this year, most likely in summer. In lieu of flowers, the family suggests donations in his name to the Chinook Tribe, a group of people who meant the world to Dr. Ames.
