

Research grants contribute \$28 million to salaries

Nearly 47 percent of the \$60.3 million that Portland State researchers brought in from external research grants over the last fiscal year have gone to pay for faculty and staff salaries and benefits. "That \$28.31 million used for salaries and benefits represents a huge savings for the University," said Mark McLellan, PSU's vice president of research and graduate studies. "If we didn't do all this research, somebody would have to cover that figure." <u>READ MORE</u>
