Planned tuition increase reduced

Portland State's Board of Trustees approved a reduction in the planned tuition and fees increase from 4.2 percent to 3.1 percent for in-state undergraduates. The board's approval fulfills President Wim Wiewel's promise that he would use additional state funding to lower tuition and improve student retention and graduation. "PSU is committed to doing everything we can to help students get in, be successful, and graduate with as little debt as possible," said PSU President Wim Wiewel. Two-factor login coming for secure network access off campus

Beginning this week, faculty and staff who use Portland State's secureaccess networks while off campus will be able to opt in to a "Duo Two Factor Authentication." This service will improve the security of sensitive data sent via VPN (virtual private networks) through secure systems such as Banner and DataMaster. The new system will incorporate users' Odin login as well as a prompt delivered to a phone or tablet at the time of login. The system will become mandatory Sept. 9, so users are encouraged to enroll early to test the feature and gain comfort with the new protocol.
