Grant to provide college access to those with intellectual disabilities

For the first time in Oregon,

individuals with intellectual disabilities will have access to an inclusive university experience. A \$2.5 million, fiveyear grant from the U.S. Department of Education Office of Postsecondary Education will create

a college program that enrolls students with intellectual disabilities in regular PSU classes and culminates in the certification of skills for eventual employability and adult life. Ann Fullerton and Susan Bert (pictured here), Education faculty, are co-directors of the project. Ruth Falco, who wrote the grant proposal, will serve as the project evaluator. The Think College Inclusion Oregon project is the first of its kind at a four-year university in Oregon. READ MORE
