New grant to help prevent sexual assault on campuses

The federal government has given a Portland State professor a \$750,000 grant to design a comprehensive and replicable manual to help colleges and universities stop sexual assaults before they occur. Keith Kaufman, psychology professor, applied for and was awarded one of two grants through a U.S. Department of Justice program on monitoring and tracking sex offenders. The proposal involves working with eight public and private universities across the country, including PSU, Linfield College and Portland Community College, to develop a sexual assault prevention manual.
