was 69. Prof. Carter died peacefully at home after nearly six years of defying prostate cancer. He was surrounded by friends and family, including his wife, Jan Kurtz. A celebration of life is scheduled for 11 a.m. Saturday, March 19, at Westminster Church in Northeast Portland.
