Last week, the University announced a program that will pay tuition and mandatory fees for qualifying Oregonians entering Portland State as full-time freshmen starting in fall 2017. Called "Four Years Free," the program is designed for students who are Oregon residents, have a 3.4 grade point average and have applied for and accepted federal and state grants for low-income families.
