Building a new village of tiny homes

Architecture students and faculty recently helped build <u>sleeping pods in Clackamas County</u> to shelter veterans making the transition to permanent housing. Almost 700 trusses for the tiny houses came from the <u>stage that was created</u> by architecture students for the Pickathon Music Festival in August. \$2 million pledged for Athletics

Food cart pod near Library grows New additions to the Millar Library Food Cart Pod on the north side of
