PSU outlines progress toward climate-neutral campus

This summer, the University's Campus Sustainability Office released the 2013 Climate Action Progress Report, a follow-up to Portland State's first Climate Action Plan signed by President Wim Wiewel in 2010. The report calls for PSU to attain climate neutrality — balancing the amount of carbon released with an equivalent amount sequestered or offset — by 2040, and identifies emission reduction goals for six areas: buildings and energy, materials, travel, commuting, education and research, and EcoDistrict development.
