Call for input on budget planning

President Wim Wiewel has challenged the University community to identify ways to increase revenues and cut costs to balance a \$15 million projected shortfall in Portland State's 2014-15 budget. A letter outlining the process was posted on the PSU website Nov. 6. "No decisions have been made, and the review process will take several months," Wiewel wrote.
