Tentative contract agreement averts a strike

Portland State University and the American Association of University

Professors reached a tentative contract settlement Sunday that avoids a threatened faculty strike. The agreement ends a year of contract negotiations with the AAUP, which represents 1,200 tenured and tenuretrack professors, fixed-term faculty and academic professionals. Contract terms were hammered out with the help of state mediators after representatives for PSU and AAUP spent 32 hours in negotiations Friday, Saturday and Sunday morning. The agreement must be ratified by AAUP-represented faculty later this month. FOR DETAILS
