Discussion of University budget May 27

The campus community is invited to a town hall discussion of the University's 2014-15 budget on Tuesday, May 27, from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the Smith Union Ballroom. PSU has taken steps to make cuts and increase revenues to cover a projected \$15 million shortfall next fiscal year that is largely due to declining state revenues, rising health insurance and pension costs, and flat student enrollment. Those attending will be able to pose questions to PSU officials. Refreshments will be served.

New contract with faculty approved

Portland State and the OREGON University System have given final approval to the new two-year collective bargaining agreement for faculty represented by the American Association of University Professors. Members of the faculty union ratified the contract with a 97 percent vote on April 22. The contract provides 2.5 percent salary increases for members effective at the beginning of both 2014 and 2015, and an additional one-time salary increase of 1.5 percent for tenure, tenure-track and fixed-term faculty in fiscal year 2014-15.
