\$24 million grant to help diverse students

The University will receive a \$24 million research and training grant, the largest in PSU history, to

help underrepresented and diverse students pursue careers in biomedical and health research fields. The National Institutes of Health grant will fund support for students of Hispanic, African American, American Indian, Alaska Native and Pacific Islander heritage; as well as students with disabilities, histories of foster care or economic disadvantage.

The University will use the grant to support its new Enhancing Crossdisciplinary Infrastructure Training at Oregon program. Students accepted by the program will receive scholarships, stipends, mentoring, summer seminars, paid job experience and dedicated academic and financial aid advising. READ MORE
