"Tools for Improving Orientation Advising" is one of five recently completed Provost's Challenge projects. There are a total of 24 faculty and staffinitiated projects enhancing educational delivery through technology. The Orientation Advising project includes a one-page student academic "snapshot" and prerequisite math placement exams for designated majors. Martha Dyson, academic adviser for the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, led the project.

Local and sustainable food choices at Portland State will soon be on the rise, thanks to a revision to PSU's dining services

contract. Under a new amendment developed by the Campus Sustainability Office and PSU's food services provider, Aramark, PSU Dining will increase total local and third-party certified food expenditures each by 5 percent annually, based on purchases made in 2014.
