Trustees approve tuition increase

The Portland State Board of Trustees recently approved a 4.2 percent increase in tuition and fees for Oregon undergraduates next fall, citing the lack of state financial support for higher education. The increase, combined with a proposed \$4.7 million cut in PSU's spending next academic year, is necessary to balance the budget and avoid deeper campus cuts, said University officials. President Wim Wiewel said a smaller tuition increase would occur if the Legislature allocates more money to PSU and other universities as lawmakers deliberate over the state budget in the coming months.
