utility costs, a second round of projects has been selected for funding through the University's Green Revolving Fund. Projects include enhancing motion sensors and lighting control timers, switching to LED lights, and enhancing morning warm-up and cooling controls in buildings. Established in 2013 with a \$500,000 initial investment, the fund pays for energy and water efficiency upgrades on campus.
