PSU report examines student and employee basic needs insecurity

A <u>new report</u> from PSU's Homelessness Research and Action Collaborative found that PSU students experience housing insecurity, homelessness and food insecurity at higher rates than average for students of four year institutions. Of PSU employees, 22.7% experienced housing insecurity, 5.6% experienced homelessness and 16.5% experienced food insecurity.

Save the date for PSU's Equity Summit


