A COE Foundation Message of Thanks

The COE Foundation team would like to thank our donors for bringing joy every year and casting an even brighter light during the gray days of the pandemic. Donors truly showed their strength this academic year.

These generous spirits more than doubled their gifts and pledges, from \$1.2 million in 2018–19 to \$2.4 million in 2019–20. These funds create opportunities for students, faculty, staff and the education community through scholarships, programs and community partnerships.

The COE Endowment remained strong this year amidst market volatility related to the COVID-19 pandemic. We ended the fiscal year this past June with \$2.3 million, slightly down from \$2.4 million in the previous fiscal year.

Because of our donors' generosity, we are able to honor 115 recipients with 157 scholarships in the 2020–21 school year, with 34 students receiving two or more scholarships averaging \$2,938 apiece. These awards in past years have changed the lives of students like <u>ALEXIS ATWOOD</u>, <u>NABIN DHIMAL</u>, <u>KATIE TAPIO</u> and <u>KEVIN WALKER</u>.

Our donors also make it possible for us to offer incredible programs, including the Portland Teachers Program, which helps us recruit and retain teachers of color, and Career and Community Services, an inclusive college experience for students with intellectual disabilities.

In addition, because of our donors, we can provide community partnership opportunities, such as the COE Mutually Beneficial Partnership Grants program. These grants allow professors to implement researchbased initiatives related to professional development, curriculum design, intervention plans for students with significant behavior support needs and more!

The COE couldn't do all that we do without our donors. We are delighted with all we have accomplished this year, together. We look forward to many more years of successful scholarships, programs and partnerships!
