The Senior Portfolio is submitted for approval by **Week 3 of the quarter of graduation** by emailing grdstudy@pdx.edu.

***Grades:** All major courses must be taken for a letter grade and passed with a C or higher

***Residency:** A minimum of 24 credits for the Creative Writing major must be taken at Portland State

***Internships:** 1-4 credits per term can be earned for completing an internship and registering for WR 411 Internships and up to 8 credits total of internship credits can apply to the major under the writing electives. Internships for Creative Writing majors are highly recommended.
