How can faculty and staff support a student who is thinking about dropping courses or withdrawing due to serious illness?

When a student has been affected by serious illness (including COVID-19), consider how it may affect the student's ability to persist at PSU. Here are some steps to take and resources to have on hand to assist your students.

- Refer your student to PSU CARES in Student Affairs.
 - PSU CARES have CARE Advocates available to meet with students facing barriers to their academic success. We will work with them to create a plan for managing their academic situation using the Deadline Appeal Petition, negotiation of incompletes, and other resources in the Office of the Registrar.
- Recommend your student <u>connect with their academic advisor</u>.
- Direct your student to the <u>Registrar's website</u> to learn more about deadlines, petitions, and withdrawals.
- The <u>Deadline Appeal Petition</u> is available for students to request registration changes after posted deadlines based on medical or any other unforeseen circumstances.
 - Students who have additional questions about making changes to their schedule due to medical reasons can contact the <u>Office of the Registrar</u> or <u>PSU CARES</u> to discuss options based on the term schedule and individual circumstances.
 - In order to support academic success from Spring 2020 through Spring 2021, the
 university has enacted a temporary policy change to allow academic departments
 to expand the use of the P/NP grading option.
- If the situation affects your student's ability to access basic needs, encourage them to look into these additional resources and support services:
