### **Facts about Federal Employment**

- The U.S. government is the largest employer in the United States, hiring over 2% of the nation's workforce—approximately 2.1 million federal civilian employees
- Federal government jobs can be found in every state and large metropolitan area, including overseas in **over 140 countries**
- Average annual salary for full-time federal government jobs exceeded **\$94,463** in 2018



### **Facts about Federal Employment**

- In 2018 total federal compensation averaged \$135,971 when benefits such as health care and pensions are included
- The federal government hires hundreds of thousands each year to replace civil service workers who transfer to other government jobs, retire, or leave for other reasons
- Eighty five percent (85%) work outside the Washington, DC metropolitan area



### Why Consider a Federal Career

Greater job stability Excellent perks and incentives Diversity of occupations

#### Five Reasons to Work for Federal Government:

- Better job security and higher pay
- Strong Focus on work-life balance
- Comprehensive medical benefits
- Generous retirement benefits, e.g., pension, social security benefits, Thrift Savings Plan
- Added perks, e.g., recruitment bonuses, relocation bonuses, incentive awards, retention allowances, employee development and continuing education, student loan repayment

- Inquisitive
- Moderate risk taker

- Federal jobs use various pay levels (eff. January 2020) based on education, experience, and location
- Base pay changes with job location

GS- 7	\$37,301	\$48,670	\$52,759
GS- 9	\$45,627	\$59,534	\$64,535
GS- 11	\$55,204	\$72,030	\$78,081

## **Other Job Search Areas:** Pathways Internships

- Who can apply?
  - Current students enrolled in an accredited college/university pursuing a qualifying degree or certificate.

#### • Program details:

- Administered by each hiring agency
- Agencies may hire interns for part- or full-time work
- May be converted to a permanent position upon completion of the program
- Must complete at least 640 hours of work experience through the internship



# **Other Job Search Areas: Recent Graduates Program**

#### • Who can apply?

- Must have graduated within the previous two years
- (Veterans have up to six years to apply)

#### • Program details:

- Administered by each hiring agency
- One- year professional development program, including mentorship and
- structured training
- May be converted to a permanent position upon completion of the program
- Must complete at least one year of continuous service to be eligible for conversion



# **Other Job Search Areas:**

### **Presidential Management Fellowship**

- Who can apply?
  - Must have completed an advanced degree within the past two years OR will complete advanced degree requirements by August 31 of following application year cycle
- Program details:
  - OPM typically opens application in late summer/early fall
  - Two-year appointment, including senior-level mentorship, 160 hours of structured training, and rotational opportunities at other agencies
  - May be converted to a permanent position upon completion of the program
  - Apply at <u>PMF.gov</u> (Unfortunately, application deadline for 2021 closed on October 14, 2020)



# **Manage Your Expectations**

- Start your job search early
  - Application to onboarding can take over a year
- Set reasonable goals (e.g. apply to one federal job per week)
- Be realistic about the job search process
  - You may not land your dream job right away, but don't give up!
