**Second Language Proficiency:** 2 years **or equivalent of** a language study in **one** language appropriate to regional focus. *Arabic\*\**, *Hebrew, Persian, Turkish. \*\*International Studies Middle East focus majors who are beginning their study of Arabic at Portland State University must complete 24 credits of course work. Every student starts with First Year Arabic, but will have the opportunity to tailor their subsequent class work to focus on Modern Standard Arabic(\*), or on Spoken Arabic(\*), or a combination. Additional course work above the 200-level is recommended, but not required. Students of First Year Arabic may find it helpful to consult with the advisor for Arabic in the World Languages and Literatures Department to determine which sequence best fits their needs and interests. Note that the third option does not earn any upper-division credit*
