Minutes from October 25 meeting

It was moved (Holz) and seconded (Nadeau) to approve the October 25 minutes as submitted. The motion was approved unanimously.

Announcement: AI software at Grad Council

Lubitow announced that AI software will not be allowed for notetaking at GC. Software such as Otter.ai effectively shares recordings with a 3rd party. Since PSU does not have a contract in place with Otter.ai to ensure the recorded data is handled appropriately, the Graduate Council will not permit notetaking with Otter.ai or other AI software for the time being.

- CRTGR in Principal License - new certificate program

Marrone joined the meeting to discuss the proposal. COE already offers admin licensure for principals; this proposal takes the existing courses and creates a graduate certificate. Students pursuing licensure only are not eligible for financial aid; creating a graduate certificate to complement the licensure program provides aid eligibility. Few students in principal licensure programs receive tuition support from their employers, and the program has a high number of credits, so financial aid eligibility is critical for students to complete this program. With the addition of financial aid eligibility, the program expects to see an increase in enrollment.

Marrone was excused.
