

## WebCAPE

WebCAPE is an adaptive, non-credit, language exam available to Portland State University students wanting to prove proficiency in Spanish, French, or German to meet the PSU language requirement.

### Approval for Proctoring

- The Department of World Languages requires PSU students to submit an Examination Request form and receive approval in order to take the WebCAPE. Students need to contact [The Department of World Languages](#) before scheduling an appointment.
- The Department of World Languages also requires students to take WebCAPE exams prior to the end of week 8 during each term.

### Fees

There are two fees for the WebCAPE exam, paid separately:

- 1) SHAC Testing Services charges a \$12 proctoring fee, billed to the student's PSU account.
- 2) A \$10 fee is paid to WebCAPE directly on the test day. Students will need to bring a debit/credit card in order to pay this fee. Payment prior to the exam day will invalidate proctored WebCAPE scores.

### Appointments

- Appointments are required and available as space permits.
- Exams must be scheduled at least 24 hours prior to the intended appointment time.
- All scheduling is done through our [online scheduling system](#).
- To reschedule an appointment, contact SHAC Testing Services prior to the exam time.
- To cancel an appointment, contact SHAC Testing Services prior to the exam time, and you will not be billed the proctoring fee.
- If a student does not show up for the scheduled appointment, the \$12 proctoring fee will be billed to the student's PSU account.

### Test Day

Be prepared on the test date with:

- A current photo ID.
- Your PSU Student ID number.
- A debit or credit card for the \$10 WebCAPE fee.

### Testing Policies

- Valid photo ID is required prior to testing.
- Only permitted testing materials are allowed in the testing room.
- All personal items and prohibited materials must be stored in lockers prior to testing. Lockers are free and secure.
- Prohibited items include, but are not limited to:
  - Cell phones, pagers, and other electronic and recording devices.
  - Watches, fit-bits, and electronic bands.

- Hats.
- Bags.
- Food (including candy and gum).
- Beverages (including water).
- Any unauthorized testing aids.
- Testers may not access personal items, or leave the building, at any time during the exam.
- Time warnings will not be provided. Test takers are responsible for monitoring their testing time.
- Testing must be completed by 5 p.m.
- Tests will not be administered past the deadline set by the instructor or institution.
- SHAC Testing Services provides pencils, scratch paper (if allowed), and noise reduction devices.
- Testing rooms are monitored by closed-circuit cameras.
- Testing Services is a fragrance free environment.
- Children cannot enter the testing room and cannot be left unattended.

## Scores

After the exam, a copy of the Score Report will be issued to the student, and SHAC Testing Services will send a copy to the Department of World Languages.
