Stephanie Coontz is the award-winning author of *"A Strange Stirring": The Feminine Mystique and American Women at the Dawn of the 1960s*, *Marriage, A History: How Love Conquered Marriage*, and *The Way We Never Were: American Families and the Nostalgic Trap*.

Coontz has published articles in the *New York Times*, *The Observer*/*Guardian*, *The Times of London*, *Wall Street Journal*, *Salon*, *Washington Post*, *Newsweek*, *Harper's*, *Vogue*, *LIFE*, *Time-LIFE Books*, and *Mirabella*, as well as in such professional journals as *Annals*, *Family Therapy Magazine*, *Chronicle of Higher Education*, *National Forum*, and *Journal of Marriage and Family*. She has contributed chapters to more than 25 academic books.

She teaches history and family studies at The Evergreen State College in Olympia, WA, and is the director of Research and Public Education for the Council on Contemporary Families.
