ADULT FOSTER HOMES IN OREGON

Adult foster homes (AFH) may be licensed to care for 1-5 adults. The owner or a paid caregiver live in the home. Services include daily meals and snacks, assistance with personal care, health monitoring and supervision, medication administration, and care coordination. The Oregon Department of Human Services licenses and monitors AFHs.

There were 1,542 adult foster homes with a capacity for 6,653 residents in 2014.

22% licensed to 1—3 residents 79% licensed for 4—5 residents 89% of providers live in the AFH




Payment sources

- 34% of residents paid with private resources
- 66% of residents were Medicaid clients AFH staffing
 - 21% of providers were certified nursing assistants
 - 9% of providers were licensed nurses
 - 16% of AFHs had a resident manager
 - AFHs employ an average of 1.6 caregivers

Oregon DHS contracted Portland State University's Institute on Aging to survey all assisted living, residential care, and memory care communities in 2014. Results are based on provider responses to a self-administered questionnaire. A total of 75 memory care communities with 1,816 units responded, for a 53% response rate.
