ASSISTED LIVING FACILITIES IN OREGON

Provide daily meals and snacks, assistance with personal care, health monitoring and supervision, medication administration, and care coordination; are staffed 24-hour daily; and have private apartments with kitchenette and private bathroom.

The Oregon Department of Human Services licenses and monitors ALFs.

There were 217 assisted living facilities with a capacity for 14,436 residents in 2014.














Resident Length of Stay (percent)
