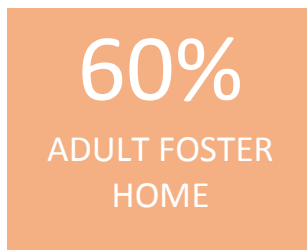
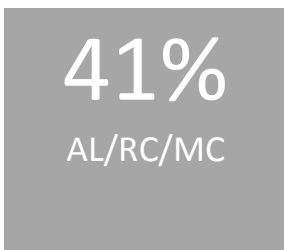


RATES AMONG COMMUNITY-BASED CARE SETTINGS IN OREGON

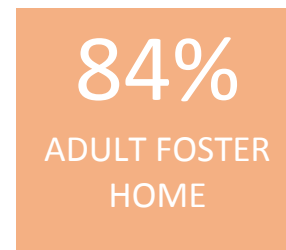
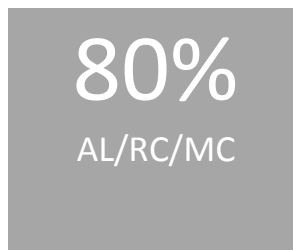
To qualify for Medicaid, CBC residents must meet financial eligibility criteria and the Department of Human Services' criteria for "nursing home level of care."

These criteria are based on the individual's need for assistance with daily activities such as bathing, dressing and eating (among other services). The Medicaid rate (below) includes the monthly room and board charge of \$570.

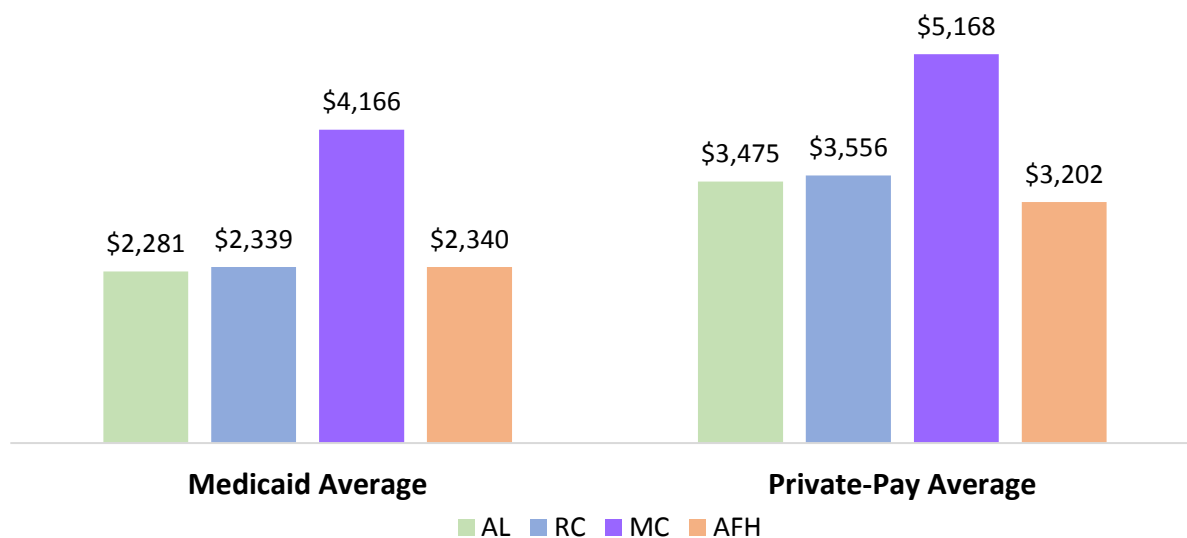
Percentage of Residents Whose Service Payment is Made by Medicaid



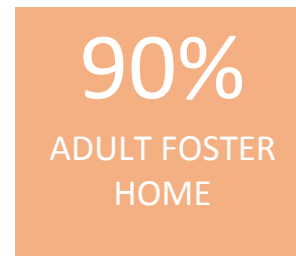
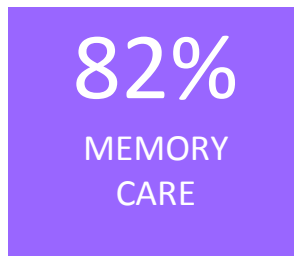
Percent of Communities that Accept Medicaid Payments



Average Monthly Charge, Medicaid and Private Pay, 2016

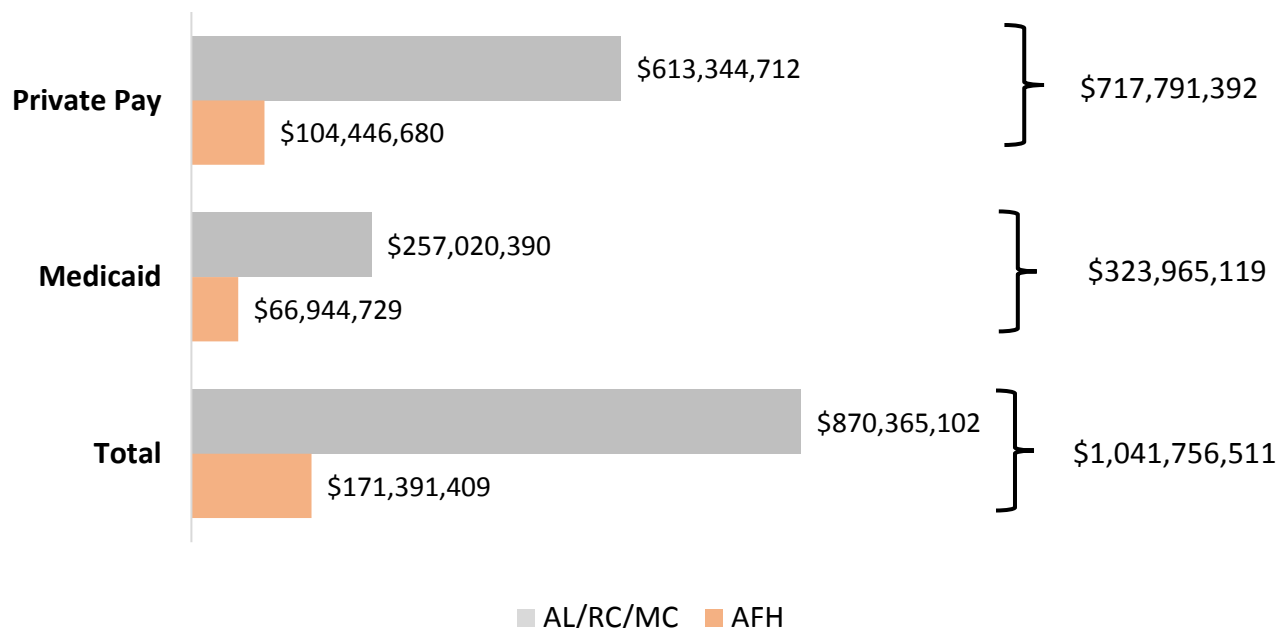


Percent of Communities that Permit Private Pay Residents Who Qualify for Medicaid to Stay



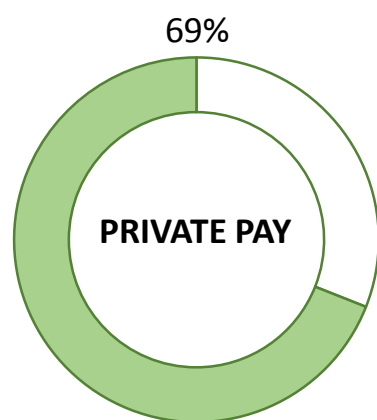

Medicaid is an important source of income for community-based care settings and it expands access to these settings on behalf of low-income older Oregonians. Nationally, only 47% of CBC settings accept Medicaid.



Although 41% of AL/RC/MC residents and 60% of AFH residents are Medicaid recipients, Medicaid accounts for 31% of total annual profession charges.

Oregon DHS contracted Portland State University's Institute on Aging to conduct a survey of a statewide sample of adult foster homes in 2015.
