






Population Growth






Components of Net Migration, 2009








Percent Change in Headship Rates by Age, 2000 to 2010, Portland MSA



Educational Attainment


Percent of Population with a BA or more, 2006-2010

Unemployment Rate and Education












Wages and unemployment relative to Metro US

Who is Cost Burdened?






Where are the High Cost Loans? *High cost loans as a share of home purchase loans, 2004-2007*




Foreclosures and Delinquencies, June 2011
