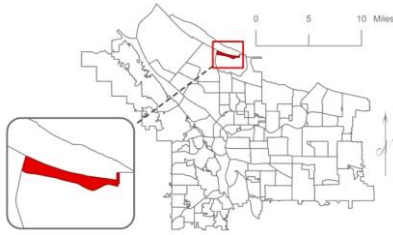

¹ Each neighborhood's most noticeable variables (top 5 and bottom 5) are presented in the table. The rank represents the neighborhood's standing among 94 neighborhoods and 4 unclaimed areas in Portland. Rankings are not applicable for Portland City.

² Data for 2010 were based on the 2010 Census and 2006-2010 5-year ACS while data for 2020 were based on the 2020 Census and 2016-2020 5-year ACS. Due to data unavailability in the 2006-2010 ACS, the 2009-2013 ACS was used for the following variables: rent burden, severely rent burden, crowding, median home value, and median contract rent.

³ Households that spend ≥30% of income on rent (≥50% of income indicates severely rent burdened).

⁴ A household is considered crowded if there are, on average, 1.5 or more occupants per room in the house.

⁵ Number represents family households with the presence of 1 or more own children under 18 years old.

⁶ Coefficient of Variation (CV) is an indicator of data reliability. CV was calculated based on the margin of error (MOE) at the census block group or tract level. High reliability: CV < 15 (not flagged). Medium reliability: 15 ≤ CV ≤ 30 (● yellow). Low reliability: CV > 30 (● red). Variables with zero estimates or CV greater than or equal to 99 are flagged as red. CV is only shown for the 2016-2020 5-year ACS variables.

⁷ Race/ethnicity is presented using "Alone or in combination" method, which counts the population who are two or more races multiple times-- once for each of the groups that are identified. Because each person reporting two or more races is counted two or more times, this method sums to "total races tallied", which may exceed the total population. Race/ethnicity breakdown is shown for the total population, as well as population under 18 years old.

⁸ Food insecurity refers to USDA's measure of lack of access, at times, to enough food for an active, healthy life for all household members and limited or uncertain availability of nutritionally adequate foods (<https://www.feedingamerica.org/hunger-in-america/food-insecurity>).

⁹ The U.S. Census Bureau defines disability as having difficulties in anyone of the following: hearing, vision, cognitive, ambulatory, self-care, and independent living.

¹⁰ The CDC uses 15 social factors to determine the social vulnerability of a region. The number shown here is the percentile based on the SVI of the tracts each neighborhood belongs in. Higher number indicates higher vulnerability. Maximum value equals to 1. www.atsdr.cdc.gov/placeandhealth/svi/index.html

¹¹ Selected non-English languages spoken by 1,000 or more individuals in Portland, OR. Percentage indicates breakdown of languages spoken by persons 5 years old and over in limited English households.
