Campus Public Safety Committee (CPSC) - May 18, 2018

Convened: 1:05 pm

Topic: Welcome, review of meeting notes and member announcements.

Discussion: CPSC approved the 4/20/18 meeting notes without changes. CPSC members congratulated Luis Baldera-Villagrana on his election as ASPSU President for the 2018-19 academic year.

Action: Staff will post the meeting notes to the Committee's website.

Topic: CPSC recruitment

Discussion: With some CPSC members terming-out, retiring and graduating, the committee will be recruiting for new members. The Board's charge requires the committee's membership to be diverse and representative, so the committee will be doing targeted recruiting to meet this charge, while offering the opportunity to serve to all PSU students, faculty and staff.

CPSC members expressed an interest in expanding the eligibility categories to include alumni and members of the PSU foundation. They also want to recruit folks representing key constituent groups that should be included on such a committee, i.e. from the campus' many multi-cultural and student resource centers.

At a minimum, we need to recruit four more CPSC members for next year, two of which should be students (UG and Grad).

Recruiting outreach should include reaching out to: Grad students, to Academic Advisors, and to International Students.

Possible outreach venues should include: Party in the Park, the Pride Parade, Campus resource centers (Casa Latino, Multi-cultural Center, Queer Resources, Women's Resource...etc.)

Action: Address these questions in the next recruiting effort:

- Which constituent groups are not being recruited?
- Should the CPSC have dedicated slots for key groups?
- What about athletes?
- There are a lot of children on campus, should they be represented?
- How about the students in residential life?
- Minority and Disabled students?
- What about campus safety skeptics?

Topic: CPSO Chief's report.

Discussion: Chief Tanksley updated the CPSC on the CPSO's extensive activities since the last meeting; some highlights included:

- CPSO's SEIU contract to be ratified by Sept.
- ASPSU has approved funding for the purchase of directional antennae for CPSO.
- CPSO is moving to 4/10 shift scheduling in order to maximize coverage and address officer wellness and safety.
- A new Visitor/Badge system has been implemented for those visiting CPSO. This brings PSU in compliance with the security policies of the FBI and the Criminal Justice Information Services.
- CPSO dispatch and the city's Bureau of Emergency Communications will be doing joint training on Portland's Versa-term system.
- Access control at the new building at 4th and Montgomery will be an issue. CPSC members are concerned that CPSO is not being brought in early enough in the design process to improve the safety of the building. The example they used was the isolated bathroom in the ASRC where we have had at least two reported incidents in the past year.
- PSU Parking is concerned with the increased number of break-ins. They will be meeting with CPSO to develop a collaborative strategy for reducing/deterring break-ins. CPSO would benefit from having "read only" access to the T2 system in the parking garages.

Action: CPSC to work with CPSO to identify safety "issues" to which the committee can respond. Now, the Chief's report consists of a list of accomplishments since the last meeting. While this is important, CPSC members wish to spend less time on this type of report and more time working on specific issues of concern.
